SUMMARY OF CRIME/INCIDENT

On 11/19/16 at about 8:03 pm, UC Davis Police was made aware of a suspicious circumstance that occurred at the above addresses.

On 11/19/16 between 6:55 pm to 7:04 pm, an unknown male subject claiming to be an Uber driver, picked up two females at the above address in the City of Davis. During the ride, the driver made comments regarding kidnapping the females to Sacramento. The females did not suffer any physical harm and were dropped off at their residence before calling police.

Subject: The driver was described as a bald white male, in his 40s, goatee, with a profile name of "Shaun." Wore black leather gloves with the finger tips cut off.

Vehicle: The vehicle was described as a four door Kia Forte, unknown license plate. Interior of car has color changing lights along floorboards.

CAMPUS COMMUNITY SAFETY TIPS FROM UC DAVIS POLICE

- Always be alert to your surroundings.

- Be aware of location and situation that will make you vulnerable to crime, such as alley and dark parking lots.
- Avoid people and situations that make you nervous – trust your instincts!
- Whenever possible, travel with a friend.
- Stay in well-lighted areas as much as possible.
- Walk close to the curb and avoid doorways, bushes and alleys where someone could hide.
- Walk confidently and at a steady pace, making eye contact with people when walking.
- Use UC Davis Police Safe Rides after hours on campus by calling 530-754-COPS or download our free smart phone application (TAPRIDE)
- If you ever feel you or others are in danger, call 9-1-1.
