CLERY notices are released by the UC Davis Police Department when certain crimes are reported on or near campus property, in compliance with federal law. LOCATION OF INCIDENT/CRIME- **Haring Hall**

SUMMARY OF CRIME/INCIDENT- UC Davis Police responded to a call for service in the area of Haring Hall. A subject was seen in the women's bathroom and potentially was holding a knife. There was a heavy smell of marijuana in the bathroom. The suspicious subject was last seen leaving the building via the south door. Officers checked the area of the Bus turnaround, Haring hall and the Silo complex. There were no other reports of suspicious persons observed in the area.

CAMPUS COMMUNITY SAFETY TIPS FROM UC DAVIS POLICE

Always be alert to your surroundings.

- Be aware of location and situation that will make you vulnerable to crime, such as alley and dark parking lots.
 - Avoid people and situations that make you nervous – trust your instincts!
 - Whenever possible, travel with a friend.
 - Stay in well-lighted areas as much as possible.
 - Walk close to the curb and avoid doorways, bushes and alleys where someone could hide.
 - Walk confidently and at a steady pace, making eye contact with people when walking.
 - If you have a backpack or bag, carry it securely against you. Although a purse-snatcher's intent is to steal the purse, your personal safety may require you to give it up.
 - Use UC Davis Police Safe Rides after hours on campus by calling 530-754-COPS or download our free smart phone application (TAPRIDE)
 - If you ever feel you or others are in danger, call 9-1-1.
