### LOCATION OF INCIDENT/CRIME

Orchard Park Circle at the Highway 113 Pedestrian Overpass, Davis, Ca. 95616

### SUMMARY OF CRIME/INCIDENT

On Saturday 11-12-2016, at approximately 1324 hours, a woman walking westbound on Orchard Park Circle, just east of the Highway 113 pedestrian overpass, saw a male subject sitting on a tree stump. As the woman passed the male subject, she noticed he was looking at her while committing a lewd act upon himself. The male subject did not attempt to contact or communicate with the woman. The woman ran from the scene and called law enforcement. UCDDPD officers searched the area but were unable to locate the male subject.

The subject was described as a white male in his 50's with grey/white hair, heavysset build, wearing a blue/grey cotton shirt and matching shorts.

This crime is currently unsolved and an investigation is ongoing. Anyone with information about this or similar incidents should call UCDDPD at 530-754-COPS (2677). ### CAMPUS COMMUNITY SAFETY TIPS FROM UC DAVIS POLICE

Always be alert to your surroundings.

- Be aware of location and situation that will make you vulnerable to crime, such as alley and dark parking lots.
  - Avoid people and situations that make you nervous – trust your instincts!
  - Whenever possible, travel with a friend.
  - Stay in well-lighted areas as much as possible.
  - Walk close to the curb and avoid doorways, bushes and alleys where someone could hide.
  - Walk confidently and at a steady pace, making eye contact with people when walking.
  - If you have a backpack or bag, carry it securely against you. Although a purse-snatcher's intent is to steal the purse, your personal safety may require you to give it up.
  - Use UC Davis Police Safe Rides after hours on campus by calling 530-754-COPS or download our free smart phone application (TAPRIDE)
  - If you ever feel you or others are in danger, call 9-1-1.
