LOCATION OF INCIDENT/CRIME:

135 Dairy Road, UC Davis Campus (Dairy Road basketball courts)

SUMMARY OF CRIME/INCIDENT:

On March 3, 2016 at 11:22 pm, the male victim in this incident had been involved in a verbal altercation with the unknown suspect at the Dairy Road basketball courts. At some point the suspect physically assaulted the victim causing moderate injuries. The suspect left the scene in an unknown direction. Anyone with information about this incident is asked to call the UC Davis Police Department at 530-754-COPS.

Suspect Description:

Victim described the suspect as a 20 year old male, medium complexion, 5'10", 200lbs (heavy set) black short hair, wearing a plain grey t-shirt and black shorts.
