Crime(s): 211 PC – Strongarm Robbery 3 cases

Case # C0602-00015 - February 2, 2006 at 6:15p.m. on Regan Hall Drive

Unknown white male adult wearing a white hooded Aggie Pack sweatshirt riding a unknown type bike, rode up behind female victim who was walking on Regan Hall Drive, grabbed her IPOD from her hand and then rode off

Case # C0602-0034 - February 8, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. on Engineering Bikeway north of Kemper Hall

Unknown male, small frame build, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt riding a BMX type bike rode up behind a female victim who was riding her bike west bound on Engineering Bikeway north of Kemper Hall, grabbed victim's IPOD from her hand and rode off northbound on Bioletti Way

Case # C0602-0036 - February 8, 2006 at 7:10 p.m. south side of Tercero B Building

Unknown male under 20 years, wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt riding a BMX bike rode up behind a female victim who was riding her bike on the south side of Tercero "B" Building. The victim had her IPOD in her sweatshirt when the suspect grabbed the IPOD wires, pulling the IPOD from her sweatshirt which fell to the ground. The suspect continued off with the ear buds from the IPOD then turned around to retrieve the IPOD, but the victim retrieved it first, the suspect fled.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS:

1. If you wear an IPOD while walking or riding, keep one earpiece out so you can hear what is going on around you. Keep the IPOD secure in your pocket, out of sight.
2. Be alert to your surroundings and if accosted, yell for help if necessary. If you are moving about campus after dark, travel in pairs whenever possible.
