TIMELY WARNING: SEXUAL ASSAULT

UC Davis Police today received information of the forced sexual assault of a University of California, Davis student. The female victim indicated the assault occurred during the early morning hours of Friday February 8th, by a known assailant on-campus.

Due to current circumstances surrounding this case, more detailed information is not available at this time.

THE UNIVERSITY WOULD LIKE TO REMIND STUDENTS:

- Sexual assault is non-consensual sexual activity, ranging from unwanted sexual touching to forced intercourse
- Most perpetrators choose a victim they know
- Sexual assault includes sexual activity with someone whose judgment is substantially impaired by alcohol or drugs, whether ingested voluntarily or unknowingly
- California law and the UC Davis Student Code of Conduct prohibit sexual assault
- It is your responsibility to make sure your partner is truly consenting.
- Rape is a felony

IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF A SEXUAL ASSAULT, YOU HAVE OPTIONS AND HELP AVAILABLE TO YOU AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS. YOU CAN:

- Call 911 or 530-752-1230 to report a sexual assault to the UC Davis Police
- Call 530-754-6387 to speak confidentially to a victim advocate at the Campus Violence Prevention Program (CVPP)
- During non-business hours you can call 916-523-2419 and page the Campus Violence Prevention Program Advocate. You can also call 530-752-1230 and ask dispatch to page the on call advocate

- Referrals / accompaniment to other campus resources such as the counseling center, student health, etc

- **EDUCATE YOURSELF AND OTHERS:** Bring a CVPP speaker/peer educator to your class or student group.
- **SPEAK OUT:** Challenge attitudes and comments that contribute to the culture of violence.
- **SPREAD THE WORD:** No one ever deserves to be raped. Sexual assault is NEVER the victim's fault.
