LOCATION OF INCIDENT/CRIME

Howard Way at Tennis Court Lane, 211- Robbery

SUMMARY OF CRIME/INCIDENT

On 10/4/18 at 5:10 a.m., unknown suspects drove down Tennis Court Lane, where a local news crew had set up their camera equipment. Suspect #1, approached the camera that had been set up and grabbed the camera along with the tripod. As the suspect was returning to the vehicle, the victim grabbed the camera from the suspect but the suspect was able to pull the camera away from the victim's grasp. Suspect #1 got into the vehicle and as the suspects fled the scene, their vehicle struck the victim. The suspect vehicle fled towards Russell Blvd. The victim sustained minor injuries.

CAMPUS COMMUNITY SAFETY TIPS FROM UC DAVIS POLICE

Always be alert to your surroundings.
